SEPTEMBER MEANS BACK TO SCHOOL, FOR MANY OF US

With the start of September brings the return to school, not only for students, but for our neighbors who teach in the school system or at the local universities. Even I fall into this category for, in addition to my full-time job, I teach an evening class for the Anthropology Department at the University of Pittsburgh. The idea for a back-to-school article focusing on neighborhood children and where they attend school originated at the August Executive Committee meeting. Often potential homebuyers visiting our neighborhood ask the question: "Where do most of the neighborhood children attend school?" With a lot of help from fellow board member Trish Burton, we believe we have found the answer to that question.

Through a series of emails and conversations at the Labor Day Corn Roast, Trish was able to determine that we have over FORTY school-age children in Allegheny West, which is pretty amazing for the size of our neighborhood. Of those for which we could confirm a school, we discovered that six attend Sewickley Academy, four attend Linden Elementary (Pittsburgh Public School), three attend The Ellis School, two attend Shadyside Academy, two attend St. Edmunds Academy, two attend CAPA Middle/High Schools (Pittsburgh Public Schools), one attends City Charter High School, one attends Friendship Academy, four attend various other charter schools, and four attend various other Pittsburgh Public Schools.

So the short answer to the question of where do neighborhood children attend school seems to be "just about everywhere." But, from the above results, many of our younger residents are schooled at private academies, charter schools, or Pittsburgh Public Schools located primarily in the East End.

TREES ARE COMING!

Tree Pittsburgh protects and restores the urban forest through community tree maintenance, planting, education and advocacy. The Pennsylvania Horticultural Society (PHS) is a nonprofit membership organization founded in 1827. PHF created the Tree Tenders program in 1993 to train residents to plant and care for trees. PHS has begun to expand the reach of its urban greening initiative and is now a partner in TreeVitalize, a program of the Pennsylvania Dept of Conservation and Natural Resources that seeks to restore the depleted tree canopy in Pennsylvania.

The above is a long explanation of the program to restore trees in neighborhoods. Allegheny West has received notification our application for trees in our neighborhood has been approved. The volunteer tree planting in Allegheny West has been scheduled for Saturday, November 3rd at 9AM. If you applied for a tree, I will be contacting you within the week.
