Congratulations to Alex Watson and Mike Coleman!

Two of our neighbors in Allegheny West were given awards at this year's Northside Leadership Conference Scholarship and Awards Dinner this past month. Alex Watson was given the yearly neighbor award and Mike Coleman was given a lifetime achievement award.

Alex Watson, a 50-year resident in Allegheny West, epitomizes the most positive aspects of a good neighbor and a community preservationist. Coming to the North Side from the northernmost sections of Allegheny County, Alex and Merle Dickinson, had an eye to the beauties of the historic home they purchased on Lincoln Avenue in 1960. Both found ways to preserve the lovely features of their new home while retaining some of its apartment units, which enabled them to slowly undertake the process of restoration.

Alex and Merle were among the founders of the Allegheny West Civic Council that emerged in the mid 1960s, when the impact of the growth of the Community College, the great demolition of many homes in the area, and the construction of highway systems threatened the very fabric of what was to be "Allegheny West." At that time, Alex, with an education in landscape design, was the manager of the Sears Roebuck garden department, the largest such operation on the North Side. It was no surprise to many of his neighbors when Alex's magnificent courtyard garden was featured in the Pittsburgh Magazine as one of the city's best urban gardens.

Alex has opened his home for community meetings, house tours, garden tours, educational tours, and always for his neighbors and friends for many social events. Alex is the epitome of what it means to be a good neighbor to all. Throughout the history of the Allegheny West Civic Council, Alex took on a leadership role in many of the organization's programs and projects.

Once elected to an office in the AWCC Mike has stayed on the Executive Committee of the Council in many different capacities, including several terms as president. From September to June of every year all Tuesday evenings in the month have been blocked into Mike's calendar for Allegheny West meetings.

Along with his role in the Allegheny West community Mike has been a an active leader in the Allegheny City Society, where he annually presents that organization's Bill Rimmel Award to the Society's honoree.

Mike has been an active director of the North Side Leadership Conference both as a representative from Allegheny West, the Allegheny City Society, and, at present, as a member at large. In these capacities, Mike was greatly involved in the creation of the North Side Development Fund and in its growth and operation for over a decade.

Added to these involvements, Mike continues to toil in the beautiful garden he and Eleanor have cultivated through the years and is always happy to allow hundreds of Allegheny West garden tour guests to visit. And it's not a successful Christmas Tour for Mike unless he can lead a minimum of three tours (each approximately two and a half hours in length) over two days. No one has been able to beat his record of three tours on one day and he continues to lobby for the fourth tour of the day to shatter his own record!

And in his "spare" time, Mike writes many articles in the North Side Chronicle as "North Side Mike."

Truly that penname says it all, and is ample reason for the Conference to present Mike with the Lifetime Achievement Award.

The AWCC congratulates both Alex and Mike for their awards and thanks them for their years of work for the neighborhood.








New AWCC Website
