Message from the President

"There is not a more delightful spot under heaven to spend any of the summer months than at this place. Here we have the town and country together. How pleasant it is in a summer evening to walk out upon these grounds, the smooth green surface of the earth, and the woodland shade softening the late fervid beams of the sun; how pleasant by a crystal fountain with the rivers and the plains beneath." - Hugh Henry Brackenridge describing the Point in 1786

Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park in California may not open this year due to huge budget cuts in the state. But here at home with spring coming we can all look forward to using our parks again and some outdoor activities. Our neighborhood is only a short walk from the Point and we can easily take advantage of the only developed State Park in Allegheny County – Point State Park. Renovations on the park should continue this year with the completion of the woodlands and promenades. The fountain and Mon connection portions of renovation come later and could be completed in late 2010. The Mon connection will allow pedestrians, joggers and cyclists to connect seamlessly from the Point to the Eliza Furnace Trail and beyond.

The renovation addresses many deficiencies of the park including old water, sewer, and electrical systems that are overburdened during large events and by flooding. Lighting, benches, trash cans, and the fountain will be upgraded and the Point will be made ADA compliant. There will be water landings to enable water taxis to take visitors across to the North Shore or to Station Square.

By 1900, the scene that Hugh Henry Brackenridge described was gone and interrupted by a dramatic scene of industrialism. Vast buildings of the Pittsburgh Exposition and clusters of warehouses stretched to the Point. It would have had all kinds of vehicles moving about, horse drawn drays, equipages, or even locomotivedrawn trains. The suspension Point Bridge was torn down in 1927, but it existed for fifty years.

Today, Pittsburgh, like a small number of other forward-thinking cities, is actively returning the balance to urban living, with great green resources available to all its citizens. The change happening at Point State Park is an excellent example of the evolving nature of a city and its citizens. From a pristine unblemished frontier vista, to a strategic military outpost, a crucible of industry for our nation, a reclaimed plot of urban green, and now a thoroughly planned public environment for the benefit of all, our neighborhood has also evolved with the tides of change that have swept Point State Park.

The fortunes of Allegheny West are intimately related to the what is happening at the confluence of the Allegheny and the Mon. We should be proud that we are a part of such an area that provides us with a uniquely high quality of urban life. The many projects we and the city have underway will pay dividends for all who call Allegheny West home for generations to come.


