drawings for the Northeast Fountain, to be located at the corner of Cedar and North Avenues, and for the park's promenade from Tripoli St to Arch Street, are now underway. The Northeast Fountain is original to the park's design (1869) and was the first of four large, ornamental fountains to be built in the park, none of which survive today.

An annual report of the City of Allegheny's Park Commission described the fountain as a 50 foot circular stone basin, with a one-foot rim of heavy cut stone. The centerpiece was a large Grecian vase, six feet in diameter and six feet high, with a principal jet 70 feet high and 16 smaller jets around the inside of the basin.



The locations of the block parties will be rotated between Beech and N. Lincoln Avenues. As in years past, AWCC will provide the main entrees, drinks, and all paper supplies. Neighbors are asked to bring a side dish or dessert to share. The menu was set as follows:

- Memorial Day: Gourmet hamburgers and hot dogs with a hot dog toppings bar
- Independence Day: Second Annual Rib Cook-Off with chicken and/or salmon
- Labor Day: Annual Corn Roast with BBQ (chicken, beef, and pork) with BBQ toppings bar

Other block party activities in the discussion and planning stages are a paper goods drive for the Food Pantry during the Memorial Day celebration, a children's parade for Independence Day, and a square dance during Labor Day.

AWCC will continue to host monthly neighborhood mixers at our local restaurants and bars. Other ideas that volunteers are exploring include a neighborhood summer camping trip, a summer porch and yard sale, an outdoor summer movie series, a fall hayride and bon fire, and trips to the Sewickley Heights Bayernhof museums.
