"LOL:"No Laughing Matter

For the past several months in this column I have often written about Allegheny West's many long and hard-fought battles to create, maintain, and preserve our neighborhood. I have recalled our dedicated and civic-minded neighbors who have donated countless hours over the years to meet with potential developers to guide appropriate development and to discourage and prevent inappropriate development, who have created both city-listed and National Register historic districts in order to preserve the neighborhood's historic character, and, who, when necessary, have engaged in litigation to protect our neighborhood from outside destructive forces. After a relatively quiet few years, it appears that one of these trying times is again at our doorstep.

Enter the Light of Life (LOL), who, until recently, has been a relatively good neighbor, inconspicuously operating their women's program and administrative offices on Western Avenue. However, a couple of weeks ago, an article appeared in the local media announcing their \$1.1 million bid for the old Ridge Avenue School Building located at 635 Ridge Avenue, which would serve as a "mega-campus" in which to combine all of their services, including the men's shelter currently located on East North Avenue, in one location.

No one was more taken by surprise than me, as I had, for the past four months have been serving as Allegheny West's representative in a series of community involvement meetings hosted by LOL. This community involvement process sprang from an initial meeting on St. Patrick's Day in the Mayor's Office. Allegheny West was asked to join the process in JUNE. Of the three meetings that were held between June and August, most of the time was spent discussing which neighborhoods and organizations should be included and which groups should be excluded, the possibility of reusing the Columbus Middle School (now in use by Propel), and reviewing architects' renderings for a new building to be constructed on California Avenue across from the Post Office. A casual mention of the Ridge Avenue site as the "staff-preferred site" was met with a swift reply from me indicating that our neighborhood would never support that use there, as the area is zoned residential and AWCC's master plan calls for the return of residential uses in that area. The discussion of the Ridge Avenue site ended, or at least so I thought, until we learned of the bid submission to the School Board.

In an attempt to avoid a lengthy battle, two AWCC board members met with LOL staff last week to request that LOL withdraw its bid on the school property. We further asked that LOL revisit its vision to create a megacampus, as we believe the impacts to a single community would be overwhelming and would be detrimental to their client base, which extends well beyond the city. LOL's executive director was unwilling to withdraw the organization's bid, but indicated that they might consider reviewing their plan to concentrate services in a single location.

AWCC was not satisfied with this response and the Executive Committee unanimously approved a motion to retain top legal counsel to assist our efforts in preventing this development in our neighborhood. In the coming weeks, it may be necessary to enlist the help of our neighbors in this matter. The topic will be discussed at AWCC's General Membership Meeting on Tuesday, November 8, beginning at 7:30 in the chapel of Calvary United Methodist Church.

Christmas Tour Update

The planning is well underway for the 30th Annual Old Allegheny Victorian Christmas House Tour. This year the tour will take place on **Friday**, **Dec. 9**, **from 5 p.m. –8 p.m. and Saturday**, **Dec. 10**, **from 10 a.m. –8 p.m**. This is the largest fundraiser for the neighborhood in terms of net proceeds AND volunteer time.

This year the tour will include the following homes: 936 Beech Avenue, the home of Kevin Luffy and Stacy Lane and baby Max; 937 Beech Avenue, the home of the Mark, Kim, Shane and Riley Moore; 840 N. Lincoln, the home of Deb Kelly and Doug Debelak; 845 N. Lincoln, the home of Alex Watson; 843 N. Lincoln, the home of Hal Dixler and Nick Dueringer; and 719 Brighton Road, the home of John DeSantis. The train museum will be open for viewing at John's house. The Holiday Shoppe at Jones Hall will be open for post-tour shopping and refreshments. House tour tickets are \$25 per person; train museum tickets are \$10 per person.


Ad Space Available in Christmas Tour Program Book




