

# HEALTHY HOMES ASTHMA PROGRAM



Women for a Healthy Environment (WHE) has been awarded a grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to help renovate homes in Allegheny County. Across Allegheny County, asthma rates of prevalence, emergency department visits, and hospitalizations are higher than the national average and disproportionately impact children of color. The WHE Healthy Homes Asthma Program will identify and enroll 130 households to deliver interventions proven to improve the health outcomes of children with an asthma diagnosis.

The interventions taken may include:

- repairing or replacing leaking roofs, windows, and downspouts
- installing bathroom and dryer vents and dehumidifiers
- removing and replacing carpeting
- sealing holes and walls to eliminate pests

Additional components of our intervention program include community and household education, technical assistance, and workforce development.
