Cocktail Corner

Hoffman House Cocktail

Build in a tumbler:

- 1 large lump of ice or ice spear
- 1 spiral orange peel
- 2oz blended scotch
- 6 oz ginger ale

"To drink slowly"

(From Hoffman House Bartender's Guide: How to Open a Saloon and Make it Pay, by Charles S. Mahone, 1905)

NOTES:

- As always, drink responsibly.
- Regular ice cubes will suffice if you don't have an ice spear maker. If your ice cubes are not large, use more than one. It's summer and you want a cold beverage.
- Be sure to express your orange peel spiral before plopping it in the tumbler. For best results, rub it along the tumbler's rim as well.
- Feel free to substitute a lime peel for the orange peel if you have limes and no oranges. I wouldn't use a lemon peel, but what do I know?
- You'll have eight ounces of liquid plus one or more ice lumps. Make sure your tumbler is large enough to accommodate all that.


