## President's Message

#### SUMMER BREAK AND REQUESTING CITY SERVICES

As has been customary for the past few years, the members of the Allegheny West Civic Council voted last month to suspend the July and August general membership meetings. General membership meetings will resume the second Tuesday of the month in September. Our committees will continue to meet throughout the summer including the regularly scheduled Housing and Planning Committee on the third Tuesday of the month and the Executive Committee on the last Tuesday of the month. With the outstanding success of the Ways and Means Committee's Tour and Tasting in Old Allegheny—our summer home and garden tour—the committee is likely taking a short break to regroup before beginning the planning of our major fundraising event, the Old Allegheny Victorian Christmas House Tour.

Lately, I have received several emails regarding problem properties in our neighborhood. These issues include graffiti on buildings, vacant and unsecured buildings, overgrown lots, stagnant water, air conditioners on street-facing windows, construction work without a building permit, construction work without a certificate of appropriateness for properties within the city historic district, and trash issues. As an affected property owner or concerned neighbor, you should call 311, which is the city's preferred method of responding to non-emergency concerns. To reach the office, simply dial 3-1-1 within the city of Pittsburgh, or 412-255-2621 from outside of the city. You can also submit an on-line 311 complaint and attach digital photos of the problem at this web address: http://pittsburghpa.gov/311/form/. Online submissions sent with a valid email address will receive an email response with a ticket number for tracking purposes. For smartphone users, you can download the myBurgh App, which is available for both Android and iOS phones. Remember to be persistent, use your tracking number to follow up with phone calls or emails, encourage your neighbors to report the same incidents, and inform the civic council of your 311 submissions so that we know what neighborhood concerns exist. Multiple submissions from various neighbors will also produce faster results! In addition to reporting the problem via 311, please be sure to forward your request and tracking number to Councilman Bobby Wilson's office by emailing Constituent Services Liaison Faith Mudd at faith.mudd@pittsburghpa.gov. Informing the Councilman's staff of 311 complaints will usually result in quicker action and enforcement. If a situation poses health risks (mosquitos, rodents, etc.), an additional course of action is to report such cases to the Allegheny County Health Department. Multiple complaints from various neighbors will also produce

When bringing these concerns to the attention of AWCC, please realize that AWCC has no enforcement powers. AWCC will not and cannot make demands on property owners or tenants; we can report violations but can do nothing to enforce compliance. Only the City of Pittsburgh and Allegheny County have enforcement power through their various departments.

#### Cocktail Corner

#### French 75 Cocktail

- 2 oz dry gin
- 0.5 oz lemon juice
- 1 bar spoons superfine sugar

Shake with ice. Strain into a cocktail glass. Fill with champagne "If you use club soda instead of champagne, you have a Tom Collins."

#### **NOTES:**

- As always, drink responsibly.
- Thanks to cocktail muse Ann Gilligan, who suggested this cocktail for the month of July, in honor of the French, our allies in the War of Independence. You needn't wait until Bastille Day (July 14) to enjoy it, though.
- The cocktail was named after the 75 mm French artillery gun used in World War I (the "Matériel de 75 mm Mle 1897").
- It was created in 1915 in Paris at the New York Bar (later called Harry's New York Bar) by Harry McElhone.
- The drink has been featured in several films, including Casablanca (1942).
- It originally was made with calvados (French apple brandy), rather than gin, and with 2 bar spoons of grenadine syrup. There was no champagne used, either. I've never tried the original recipe. Someday.
- Don't bother using your bottle of Dom Perignon for this. Any sparkling wine such as Italian Prosecco or Spanish Cava will do in a pinch, although it won't be as French as what you get with champagne.
