Cocktail Corner

Calvados Cocktail

- 1 dashes Angostura bitters
- 2 dashes curacao
- 3 drops gum syrup
- 1 oz calvados

Stir with ice, then strain into a cocktail glass. Garnish with a brandied cherry.

NOTES:

- As always, drink responsibly.
- Another month, another cocktail featuring calvados, the French apple brandy. It's available at the Premium LCB stores around Pittsburgh.
- No gum syrup? Use simple syrup made with equal parts sugar and water, heated in a saucepan. Let cool before using.
- If you don't have any brandied cherries at hand, just use some good Marasca cherries, like Luxardo. They carry them at some of the LCB stores, but I get mine at the Mayfly Market on Arch Street. (I believe you can also get the Angostura bitters there.) Avoid using the day-glow maraschino cherries you see at the supermarket. Unless that's your thing.
