Cocktail Corner

William T. "Cocktail" Boothby, World Drinks and How to Mix Them (1908)

Bamboo Cocktail

- 1.5 oz. French vermouth (see Notes)
- 1.5 oz. Sherry
- 2 dashes orange bitters
- 2 drops Angostura bitters
- Garnish with a pimola

NOTES:

- As always, drink responsibly.
- This cocktail appears to have been created by one Louis Eppinger, who ran the Grand Hotel in Japan, among other establishments. The Grand Hotel was a popular destination among world travelers and celebrities at the turn of the century (the twentieth one), including Rudyard Kipling.
- "French" vermouth, in old recipes, generally refers to dry, rather than sweet, vermouth. The Bamboo can be made with either, but most recipes use sweet red vermouth (often referred to as "Italian" vermouth). I've only had this cocktail once, and it used sweet vermouth. Of course, it's possible to get sweet vermouths made in France and dry ones made in Italy (although the PLCB does not carry a large selection, so you may need to special order or "import" from another state).
- In any event, vermouth aficionados should experiment (and please report back).
- For the sherry, you can use an oloroso, amontillado, or fino; the recipes are all over the board on that one
- Proportions vary among the recipes for this drink. Some use equal parts sherry and vermouth, some favor more of one than the other. Again, experiment!
- A pimola is simply an olive stuffed with a pimiento. I learn something new every day, and then forget it.
- This drink, which is also called an Adonis, has a pretty low alcohol content for a cocktail, thereby making it easier to "drink responsibly."
