Cocktail Corner

Royal Smile

Shake with cracked Ice:

- 0.75 oz lime juice (juice of ½ lime)
- 0.5 oz grenadine
- 0.5 oz dry gin
- 1 oz apple brandy

Strain into a cocktail glass.

Attributed to The Hotel Belvedere, Baltimore, MD - George R. Washburne & Stanley Bronner. *Beverages de Luxe, The Wine and Spirit Bulletin, Louisville, 1911*

NOTES:

- As always, drink responsibly.
- The Belvedere Hotel, a Beaux Arts style building, still stands in Baltimore, Maryland. It was converted to condominiums in 1991, but the ballroom and restaurants were preserved.
- It's apple season, so here's another apple brandy cocktail. For the apple brandy, I recommend calvados from France. If you're lucky enough to have some of the U.S.-made Laird's (the real 100% apple brandy, not the neutral spirits flavored with apple brandy), then use that.
- I've mentioned before, I believe, that the limes sold in the U.S. were the small, round kind back in the day. So, it may be best to measure out three quarters of an ounce of lime juice rather than just squeezing half a lime into the shaker.
- Grenadine is available at the Fine Wine & Good Spirits store. You can also obtain better grenadine (pomegranate syrup) online.
- As with all cocktails, you may find your first batch is too sweet or too dry. A little more or less grenadine should do the trick. You could also add a spoonful of Cointreau, Gran Marnier, or triple sec to sweeten things. Those all play well with lime juice.
- Enjoy, and don't be afraid to share with your neighbors. I mean me.
