President's Message

Recycling Issues

Dear Neighbors,

While I normally write about this topic at the beginning of the year with the release of the annual recycling calendar and guidelines, I have noticed that not all of our neighbors are aware of the city's new recycling guidelines. The biggest difference this year is that the city will no longer collect recycling that is in plastic bags. Recyclables must be placed in a recycling bin loose. Failure to do so will result in the city leaving the recyclables week after week. As always, cardboard must be flattened, free of packing materials, and bundled.

For your convenience, we have included a copy of the city's current Refuse/Bulk and Recycling Pickup Schedule in this issue of the Gazette for those who didn't receive a copy directly from the city or may have misplaced it since the beginning of the year. Please retain this flyer and refer to it throughout the remainder of the year. If you already received a copy of the calendar, pass this one along to a neighbor that may not have received one, including tenants, if you have any, or residents in multi-unit apartment buildings. All too often people forget the collection/recycling schedule and refuse and recycling are left in alleys and on streets for a week or more. If you put your recycling out on the wrong day or if you miss your collection time, PLEASE do not leave trash and recycling containers on the curb until the next week's collection. You could be cited for this, and it also has a negative impact on our neighborhood. Additionally, refuse should be placed at the curb no earlier than 6:00 pm on the night before collection and no later than 6:00 am on the day of collection. Should our collection day (Monday) be on a holiday, refuse will be collected the following day.

I again encourage all of our residents to recycle. Recycling is easy with the city's "single-stream" system, which eliminates the need to separate items. The recycling program accepts glass, aluminum and metal cans, paper, cardboard, and plastics. Cocktail Corner

Dry Martini Cocktail

Stir with Ice:

- 3 dashes Angostura bitters or orange bitters
- 1 oz. dry gin
- 1 oz. dry vermouth
- Lemon peel
- Strain into a cocktail glass. Garnish with a lemon twist, a brandied cherry, or an olive..

NOTES:

- As always, drink responsibly.
- Early version of the Martini (pre-1900) called for sweet vermouth. That's a much different drink, but still very good.
- The ratio of gin to vermouth has certainly changed over the years. Martinis now are often made with a 2:1 to 4:1 ratio in favor of the gin. Some folks add no vermouth and still call it a Martini, although you might just as well call that a Gimlet or any other gin-based cocktail, if that's your thinking. Anyway, if you've never tried a 50/50 ratio, give it a try sometime to see if you like it.
- As for the brand of gin, that's up to you. I generally use Beefeaters, but good gins abound. Jane Cook swears by Tanqueray, and I won't argue with her. Hendrick's gin, with a cucumber garnish, was in vogue a few years back, and that's worth a try, too.
- I prefer the orange bitters to the Angostura, but that's just me. I usually go with two dashes, not three.
- In keeping with the orange bitters, I generally garnish with a lemon twist. I do, however, love the occasional olive garnish, and I like so-called "dirty Martinis" with a bit of the olive brine. It's all about the mood you're in, no?

Curbside Yard Debris Collection Pittsburgh Goes Plastic Bag Free!

April 20th and November 2nd

- ACCEPTED ITEMS:
 - Tree Trimmings
- Leaves Grass Plants
- Branches Shrubs

Debris must be placed in a paper bag (no plastic bags are accepted)

Branches should be bundled and tied, and no bigger than 4 inches in diameter and lengths not more than 5 feet long



We'd like to remind you that Pittsburgh has banned plastic bags and they will become increasingly scarce in our community.

Recycling in plastic bags

Recycling is collected every other week. Cardboard and other recyclable materials will only be accepted on recycling week.

What goes inside my blue bin for curbside collection in Pittsburgh?



PLASTIC CONTAINERS

Bottles, jugs & jars only. Remove lids and caps.



CARDBOARD

Flatten, bundle & place in your bin, or another box.



Bottles, jugs & jars. Remove lids and caps.



METAL CONTAINERS

Empty aluminum, aerosol, & steel cans. Leave labels on, discard lids, or leave attached to can.



MIXED PAPER

Office, newspaper, junk mail, magazines, soft/hardback books, and paperboard.

Curbside Regulations

- All items for pickup must be set out no earlier than 6:00 p.m. on the night before collection and no later than 6:00 a.m. the day of collection.
- All cans set out for collection must not exceed 35 gallons in size and must be removed from the curb after collection on your pickup day (City code 619).
- Each dwelling may only set out two bulk items per week. Carpeting and fencing must be tied and bundled not to exceed 35 lbs or 5 ft in length.
- Tires, electronics, and household hazardous waste including liquids and flammables are prohibited from curbside disposal but are accepted at various drop off locations in the city.
- · Automotive parts and large amounts of construction and demolition waste are prohibited from curbside collection.
