Cocktail Corner (or, Mocktail Mourner)

Shirley Temple

Build in a tall glass with ice:

*1 oz grenadine

*8 oz ginger ale or a lemon-lime soda, such as 7-Up or Sprite

Garnish with a cherry.

Notes

- As always, drink responsibly.
- Rose's Grenadine is readily available at PLCB stores as well as markets. You can buy superior pomegranate syrups online, though.
- Ginger ale is, apparently, more commonly used in the Northeast U.S., while other states go with the lemon-lime soda.
- This cocktail originated in the 1930s but was not formulated by Shirley Temple Black.
- I was a big fan of this drink when I was five years old. I no longer am.
- If you find it too sweet, try cutting it with seltzer or club soda.

Other Resources:

Mocktails are fairly common nowadays, and an industry of nonalcoholic "spirits" has arisen. I've tried several, and some of them aren't too bad. You can find different brands at better markets, including the Mayfly Market on Arch Street.

For those not celebrating Dryuary:

Dirty Shirley

Build in a tall glass with ice:

*2 oz vodka

*1 oz grenadine

*8 oz lemon-lime soda, such as 7-Up or Sprite (ginger ale is not used as often, but feel free to try it)

Garnish with a cherry.

Western Avenue Neighborhood Improvement District (WANID) Project Update: Electric Service Connections

With two property owners in McIntosh Row refusing to permit new electrical service connections from the rear (at no cost to the property owners), the committee explored various alternatives including trenching in front of McIntosh Row (at additional cost), and leaving poles in front of McIntosh Row, but permitting removal of the poles on the remainder of Western. A meeting is being scheduled with the McIntosh Row property owners to review these options to see if there is anything that will be agreeable to all. Any option is still subject to review and approval by Duquesne Light.
