Cocktail Corner

Ante Cocktail

- Shake with ice:
 - > 1 dash Angostura bitters
 - > 0.5 oz Hercules (see Notes)
 - > 0.5 oz Cointreau
 - ➤ 1 oz Calvados or Apple Brandy
- Strain into a cocktail glass

Notes

- As always, drink responsibly.
- > For Hercules, substitute Dubonnet. No one seems to know exactly what the recipe for Hercules was, but it appears to have been a fortified wine with some quinquina. Dubonnet is probably the most reasonable approximation and is readily available.
- The recipe calls for a single ounce of Calvados. I think you should increase it to at least one and a quarter ounces, and an ounce and a half wouldn't be uncalled for. I've done so, as Arne Saknussemm famously said. If your home bar stock doesn't yet include a bottle of Calvados after the many times I've told you to acquire some, well, I don't know what to do.
- > Shake? I don't know why Harry thinks this drink should be shaken. I stir, rather than shake, this drink to avoid cloudiness. Do as you please. You always do.

Construction on North Avenue: Signals and Safety Project

The North Avenue Signals and Safety Project is updating traffic signal infrastructure and improving safety for pedestrians, drivers, and transit users along North Avenue. Traffic signal upgrades will include higher visibility signals with back plates, controllers, communication hardware, and radar detection. Pedestrian accommodations include pedestrian countdown signals, audible push buttons, curb extensions/bumpouts, mid-block crossings, and ADA ramps. The work schedule is 7am to 5:30pm M-Th with a rain day on Fridays. Project Completion is anticipated in Summer 2026. Residents can set out: leaves; grass; plants; tree trimmings; branches, and shrubs. Branches should be bundled and tied, and no bigger than 4 inches in diameter with lengths not more than 5 feet.
